Research project title: HC-05: Developing an Equity Framework Implementation Strategy for City Plan

Research supports the following City of Vancouver policies -

- Greenest City Action Plan. Equity Focus (2019)
- ⊠ Healthy City Strategy. Specific goal area (s): Being and Feeling Safe and Included
- \boxtimes Other: Equity Framework; City of Reconciliation; City Plan

Scope of Work:

The scope of work proposed will align with the development of the City's Equity Framework and the transition from the scoping phase of City Plan to Phase 1 implementation. The research will be centred on the research question: *How are leading municipalities meaningfully integrating decolonial, racial equity, gender equity, poverty reduction, intersectional, and people-centered frameworks and practices in city-wide and community planning processes to advance less colonial and more equitable planning?*

- Review best practices on racial and gender equity principles and decolonizing methodologies and frameworks within a municipal planning context
- Analyse existing City strategies and conduct interviews and host dialogues with diversity of city staff in Vancouver
- Identify key opportunities for equity and justice promotion
- Develop a high-level implementation framework for City Plan with equity as a key foundation

Deliverables

The Healthy City Scholar will engage with the inter-departmental team developing the Equity Framework principles alongside the initial phases of City Plan to ensure the City's long-term vision is determined by all Vancouverites.

The high-level implementation framework for City Plan should include:

- Summary of best practices on racial and gender equity principles and frameworks within a municipal planning context
- Recommendations for promoting equity promotion in City of Vancouver context including gap analysis, interview summaries and dialogue outcomes
- A public facing final report (or executive summary) for the UBC Sustainability Initiative website

Time Commitment

- This project will take **250*** hours to complete.
- This project must be completed between (May 1 and July 31)
- The scholar is to complete hours between 9am and 5pm, Monday to Friday, approximately 20 hours per week.
- Scholar must be available at key stakeholder meetings (dates tbd).
