1. Executive Summary



The climate crisis, widening socioeconomic inequality, and gaps in protections for human rights present a multifaceted challenge for global citizens. To solve these wicked problems, the future generations and youths need to be equipped with appropriate tools for understanding and engaging with these complex issues. Education for sustainable development (ESD) plays a critical role in building these knowledge and skill competencies necessary for advancing the United Nations 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.



1.1. How to Use this Toolkit

This toolkit is a collection of resources for kindergarten to post-secondary educators and organizational partners interested in developing and incorporating content on the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) in their educational curriculum. It is meant to be a living document that will be regularly updated in the coming years to reflect the emergent nature of SDG resources.










To ensure that the SDG resources are useful to educators across varying levels of pedagogy, the toolkit is organized into four sections:

1. **General:** Content is suitable for students at all grade levels;
2. **Elementary and Middle School:** Content is suitable for students in grades 1 to 8;
3. **High School:** Content is suitable for students in grades 9 to 12; and
4. **Post-Secondary Institutions:** Content is suitable for students in college and university.

Each of these sections cover three themes:

1. **Application:** Reviews related behavioural and emotional learning objectives in conjunction with a list of suggested activities, projects, and lesson plans.
2. **Spotlight on Canada:** Reviews relevant geographical contexts with emphasis on the relationship between local and global impacts.
3. **Additional Resources:** Lists further resources for education on sustainable development.

Each theme offers a list of resources which are prefixed with one of the following tags to distinguish its form and inform its use by educators:

-  **Action:** Resource is action-oriented.
-  **Article:** Resource is in the format of an article.
-  **Book:** Resource is in the format of a book.
-  **Interactive:** Resource is interactive.
-  **Opportunity:** Resource is an opportunity to participate in sustainability work.
-  **Report:** Resource is structured as a report.
-  **Tool:** Resource is a teaching tool (e.g. lesson plan, activities, etc.)
-  **Video:** Resource is a video medium.
-  **Website:** Resource is curated across web pages.

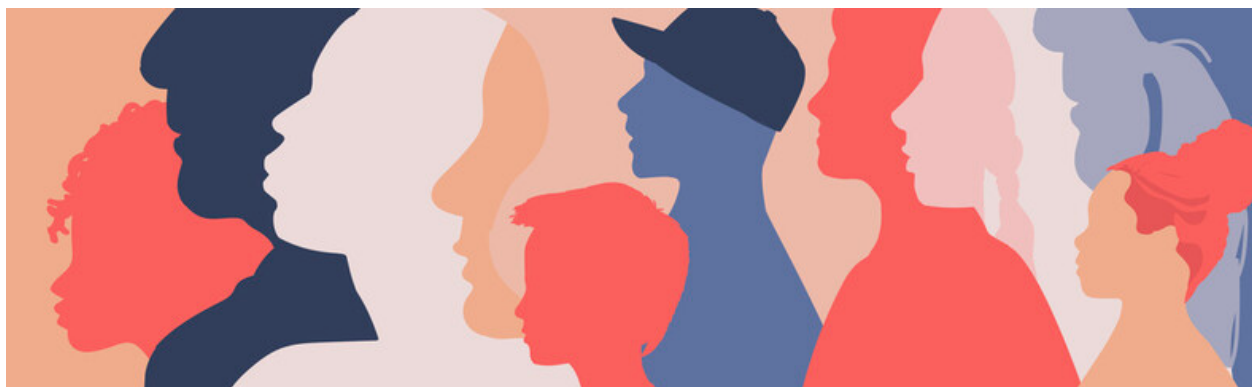
